*You are required to furnish **ORIGINALS** of **ALL** the following in order to process your temporary state pistol permit application:*

- Proof of Orange residency** (utility bill, tax statement, etc.)
- State of Connecticut picture identification** (driver's license or CT State ID Card)
- Proof of citizenship/Alien registration:** Applicants must provide proof of citizenship, such as a birth certificate, voter registration card or US Passport. Legal alien residents must provide alien registration numbers and 90 day proof of residency. Naturalized citizens require proof of citizenship.
- An application completed and NOTARIZED.** Notary name, stamp and raised seal must be visible. Answer all applicable questions, and write N/A if a question does not apply to you. **The police department DOES NOT provide notary service.**
- Letter or certificate** attesting to your completion of a course in the Safety and Use of Pistols and Revolvers, signed by a pistol or revolver instructor certified by the NRA, DEP or State of CT.
- Cashier's Check or Money Order for \$50.00** made out to: **Treasurer-State of CT** (for a state criminal history records check) **NO PERSONAL CHECKS**
- Cashier's Check or Money Order for \$19.25** made out to: **Treasurer-State of CT** (for an FBI criminal history records check) **NO PERSONAL CHECKS**
- Cashier's Check or Money Order for \$70.00** made out to: **TOWN OF ORANGE** (for local background check and application processing) **NO PERSONAL CHECKS**

Make an APPOINTMENT to submit your application and get fingerprinted. Do not attempt to drop off your application prior to being fingerprinted, it will not be accepted. You can request an appointment by calling (203) 891-2134. Appointments are available on Thursdays, the times are determined by staffing levels.

Be sure to bring **ALL** the properly completed required documentation to your appointment. The OPD will make copies as required. **Failure to provide all the proper items on the above checklist will result in the cancellation of your appointment, and a new appointment will have to be scheduled.**

After your temporary state permit has been approved by the Town of Orange, it will be valid for 60 days and cannot be renewed. You must apply within these 60 days for a permanent state permit at the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (State Police). Final instructions will be given at that time.

NOTICE: Appeal Process for Permits

In the event that your application to carry pistols or revolvers is denied or your permit is revoked, you may notify the Board of Firearm Permit Examiners, in writing, within ninety (90) days, in order to begin your appeal process. At a hearing before the Board, you may request that your application be reconsidered or that your permit be reinstated. Additionally, in the event that your permit application has not been processed by the local issuing authority within eight (8) weeks, you should notify the Board of Firearm Permit Examiners. NOTICE

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes, Sections 29-28, 29-32, 29-36f and 29-36l and Federal Public Law 104-208, s. 658: **applications covered by these instructions will not be issued or be renewed, if:**

You have a FELONY CONVICTION in any jurisdiction:

You have a MISDEMEANOR CONVICTION in Connecticut of one of the following crimes:

1. Illegal possession of controlled or hallucinogenic substances, as specified under C.G.S. 21a-279 (c)
2. Criminally negligent homicide - 53a-58
3. Assault in the third degree - 53a-61
4. Assault of a victim 60 or older in the third degree - 53a-61a
5. Threatening- 53a-62
6. Reckless endangerment in the first degree - 53a-63
7. Unlawful restraint in the second degree - 53a-96
8. Riot in the first degree - 53a-175
9. Riot in the second degree - 53a-176
10. Inciting to riot - 53a-178
11. Stalking in the second degree - 53a-181d

Or you were CONVICTED of a MISDEMEANOR CRIME of DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

This means an offense that (1) is a misdemeanor under federal or state law; and (2) has, as an element, the use or attempted use of physical force, or the threatened use of a deadly weapon, committed by a current or former spouse, parent or guardian of the victim, or by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, or by a person who is cohabiting with or who has cohabited with the victim or spouse, parent, or guardian, or by any person similarly situated to a spouse, parent or guardian of the victim.

You were discharged from custody within the preceding 20 years after having been found NOT GUILTY OF A CRIME BY REASON OF MENTAL DISEASE OR DEFECT 53a-13.

You were CONFINED TO A HOSPITAL for any psychiatric disability (17a-495) within the preceding 12 months by order of a judge of a probate court.

You are subject to a RESTRAINING ORDER or PROTECTIVE ORDER issued by a court in a case involving the use, attempted use or threatened use of physical force.

You are now subject to a Firearms Seizure Order issued pursuant to Public Act 99-212 Sec. 18, prohibiting possession of firearms.

You are an ILLEGAL ALIEN in the United States.

You are UNDER the AGE of 21 years.

You have renounced your United States citizenship.

You have been discharged from the Armed Forces under a dishonorable condition.

You are prohibited by Federal Law Section 922 (g) or (n) of Title 18 of the United States Code.
